Confession of Sin & Assurance of Pardon

L: Our Father, we have forsaken our first love and have acted as those who are afraid to suffer for your sake, or simply to endure loss for your glory. This is because we have not held to the teachings we have heard from your Word from the beginning.

ALL: We have tolerated sin in our hearts, in our families, and in our culture without lasting repentance. We have been asleep in the light and have felt lukewarm. Eclipse our dim wits by your shining grace and enliven us by your holiness.

L: Confront us once again with your love as revealed in Christ and testified by You, Holy Spirit. We need your forgiveness and mercy—the grace that flows from the throne of God like a gushing river.

ALL: Cause us to respond in a manner similar to the four living creatures, the martyrs, and the great congregation of angels and saints gathered in heaven. Make us to serve you with gladness, faithful until we reach the glory that awaits us.

L: We pray in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. (time for silent confession)

L: Hear the assurance of pardon as recorded in Psalm 103: The LORD is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in love. He will not always accuse, nor will he harbor his anger forever; he does not treat us as our sins deserve or repay us according to our iniquities. For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his love for those who fear him; as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us.

ALL: We praise our Triune God for this indescribable gift!

Song Preparation: Come to Jesus

Word: 1 John 3:11-24

"For this is the message that you have heard from the beginning, that we should love one another. We should not be like Cain, who was of the evil one and murdered his brother. And why did he murder

him? Because his own deeds were evil and his brother's righteous. Do not be surprised, brothers, that the world hates you. We know that we have passed out of death into life, because we love the brothers. Whoever does not love abides in death. Everyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him. By this we know love, that he laid down his life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers. But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth. By this we shall know that we are of the truth and reassure our heart before him; for whenever our heart condemns us, God is greater than our heart, and he knows everything. Beloved, if our heart does not condemn us, we have confidence before God; and whatever we ask we receive from him, because we keep his commandments and do what pleases him. And this is his commandment, that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. Whoever keeps his commandments abides in God, and God in him. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit whom he has given us."
