Meditation: 1 Corinthians 10:12-17

Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall. No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it. Therefore, my beloved, flee from idolatry. I speak as to sensible people; judge for yourselves what I say. The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread.

Call to Worship: Psalm 146:1-2

Opening Hymn: How Firm a Foundation | 94

Confession of Sin & Assurance of Pardon

L: Our Father, we have forsaken our first love and have acted as those who are afraid to suffer for your sake, or simply to endure loss for your glory.

ALL: This is because we have not held to the teachings we have heard from your Word from the beginning. We have tolerated sin in our hearts, in our families, and in our culture without lasting repentance.

L: We have been asleep in the light and have felt luke-warm. Eclipse our dim wits by your shining grace and enliven us by your holiness. Confront us once again with your love as revealed in Christ and testified by You, Holy Spirit.

ALL: We need your forgiveness and mercy—the grace that flows from the throne of God like a gushing river.

L: Cause us to respond in a manner similar to the four living creatures, the martyrs, and the great congregation of angels and saints gathered in heaven.

ALL: Make us to serve you with gladness, faithful until we reach the glory that awaits us. We pray in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.

L: Hear the Word of the LORD as recorded in Romans 5, "Therefore having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ."

Word: Matthew 4:1-11

1 Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. **2** And after fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry. **3** And the tempter came and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command these stones to become loaves of bread." **4** But he answered, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.'" **5** Then the devil took him to the holy city and set him on the pinnacle of the temple **6** and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down, for it is written, 'He will command his angels concerning you,' and 'On their hands they will bear you up, lest you strike your foot against a stone.'" **7** Jesus said to him, "Again it is written, 'You shall not put the Lord your God to the test.'" **8** Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their glory. **9** And he said to him, "All these I will give you, if you will fall down and worship me." **10** Then Jesus said to him, "Be gone, Satan! For it is written, 'You shall worship the Lord your God and him only shall you serve.'" **11** Then the devil left him, and behold, angels came and were ministering to him.

Questions for Reflection and Meditation

1. What is the difference between being tested and being tempted?

2. What was the devil/tempter tempting Jesus to do? Why?

3. Read 1 John 2:15-17. Which of Jesus' temptations would you say corresponds with the desires of the flesh, the desires of the eyes, and the pride of life?

4. In the Lord's prayer, we are encouraged to pray the following, "lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil." With this in mind, why do you think the Holy Spirit led Jesus to be tempted in wilderness?

5. Read James 4:7. How did Jesus submit himself to God and resist the devil? What was the result (Matt. 4:11)?

6. Our postchristian society feeds temptation up to the point it becomes unhealthy for us: food, sex, gambling etc. When we reach this breaking point, we step in and provide counseling until we learn to manage the temptation. Using Jesus' example in Matt. 4:1-11, what lessons can Christians teach our secular society about dealing with temptation?

7. What do you do when you are tempted to sin? How does the gospel address the problem of temptation and sin in your life?

How to scan a QR code with your Apple device:

- 1. Open the Camera app from the Home screen, Control Center, or Lock screen.
