Meditation: Titus 2:1-10

But as for you, teach what accords with sound doctrine. Older men are to be sober-minded, dignified, self-controlled, sound in faith, in love, and in steadfastness. Older women likewise are to be reverent in behavior, not slanderers or slaves to much wine. They are to teach what is good, and so train the young women to love their husbands and children, to be self-controlled, pure, working at home, kind, and submissive to their own husbands, that the word of God may not be reviled. Likewise, urge the younger men to be self-controlled. Show yourself in all respects to be a model of good works, and in your teaching show integrity, dignity, and sound speech that cannot be condemned, so that an opponent may be put to shame, having nothing evil to say about us. Bondservants are to be submissive to their own masters in everything; they are to be well-pleasing, not argumentative, not pilfering, but showing all good faith, so that in everything they may adorn the doctrine of God our Savior.

Sermon: "Steadfastness in the Midst of Temptation"

Word: James 1:12-18

12 Blessed is the man who remains steadfast under trial, for when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life, which God has promised to those who love him. 13 Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am being tempted by God," for God cannot be tempted with evil, and he himself tempts no one. 14 But each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire. 15 Then desire when it has conceived gives birth to sin, and sin when it is fully grown brings forth death. 16 Do not be deceived, my beloved brothers. 17 Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change. 18 Of his own will he brought us forth by the word of truth, that we should be a kind of firstfruits of his creatures.

Questions for Reflection

- 1. What similarities do you see between verse 2 and verse 12?
- 2. James says that if we remain steadfast amidst trials, we will receive a crown of life (vs. 12). Does this mean that rewards should be our primary motivation for enduring trials? How does vs. 2-4 and 16-18 help us understand the relationship between steadfastness and reward?
- 3. In the Greek language, the word for trial (testing) and temptation is the same word. Yet, James uses them in a completely different way. According to James, what is the difference between trial in vs. 12 and temptation in vs. 13?
- 4. Write out the progression of temptation in verse 14-15. How does temptation start and what is the end result of temptation?
- 5. What are the 'good gifts' referenced by James in verse 16?
- 6. Some in our day teach that desire to sin in and of itself is not sin it is beyond our control. Read James 1:12-15 again and determine how you would respond to this belief.
- 7. How does James help us discern the difference between trial and temptation in our own lives?
