Meditation: Revelation 4:1-8

After this I looked, and behold, a door standing open in heaven! And the first voice, which I had heard speaking to me like a trumpet, said, "Come up here, and I will show you what must take place after this." At once I was in the Spirit, and behold, a throne stood in heaven, with one seated on the throne. And he who sat there had the appearance of jasper and carnelian, and around the throne was a rainbow that had the appearance of an emerald. Around the throne were twenty-four thrones, and seated on the thrones were twenty-four elders, clothed in white garments, with golden crowns on their heads. From the throne came flashes of lightning, and rumblings and peals of thunder, and before the throne there was as it were a sea of glass, like crystal. And around the throne, on each side of the throne, are four living creatures, full of eyes in front and behind: the first living creature like a lion, the second living creature like an ox, the third living creature with the face of a man, and the fourth living creature like an eagle in flight. And the four living creatures, each of them with six wings, are full of eyes all around and within, and day and night they never cease to say, "Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord God Almighty, who was and is and is to come!"

Word: Philippians 4:8-9

8 Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. **9** What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me—practice these things, and the God of peace will be with you.

Questions for Reflection

1. Things that are honorable are said to be things that inspire awe/wonder or worship. What does it mean to be in awe of something?

2. How did God cultivate a sense of awe within the Israelite in the OT? What was the ultimate object of their awe?

3. What would be some of the barriers to our sense of awe or beauty in our day?

4. The Philippians lived in a context filled with idols; how would their sense of wonder and awe toward God be challenged?

5. Why is it that children seem to naturally have a sense of wonder, curiosity and awe, while adults by and large do not?

6. What captures your imagination and leaves you with a sense of genuine awe and wonder?

7. In his book on awe, Paul Tripp mentions that human beings were created for awe and wonder, but we no longer have a healthy sense of it. How do you think we can get it back? Does anything in the surrounding context of Philippians 4:8-9 point us there?
