## Meditation: 2 Corinthians 10:1-6

I, Paul, myself entreat you, by the meekness and gentleness of Christ—I who am humble when face to face with you, but bold toward you when I am away!— I beg of you that when I am present I may not have to show boldness with such confidence as I count on showing against some who suspect us of walking according to the flesh. For though we walk in the flesh, we are not waging war according to the flesh. For the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh but have divine power to destroy strongholds. We destroy arguments and every lofty opinion raised against the knowledge of God, and take every thought captive to obey Christ, being ready to punish every disobedience, when your obedience is complete.

## Call To Worship: Psalm 11

L: In the Lord I take refuge; how can you say to my soul, "Flee like a bird to your mountain, for behold, the wicked bend the bow; they have fitted their arrow to the string to shoot in the dark at the upright in heart; ALL: If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?" # Sermon: "Salvation to the Ends of the Earth"

#### Word: Jonah 1:11-17

**11** Then they said to him, "What shall we do to you, that the sea may quiet down for us?" For the sea grew more and more tempestuous. **12** He said to them, "Pick me up and hurl me into the sea; then the sea will quiet down for you, for I know it is because of me that this great tempest has come upon you." **13** Nevertheless, the men rowed hard to get back to dry land, but they could not, for the sea grew more and more tempestuous against them. **14** Therefore they called out to the Lord, "O Lord, let us not perish for this man's life, and lay not on us innocent blood, for you, O Lord, have done as it pleased you." **15** So they picked up Jonah and hurled him into the sea, and the sea ceased from its raging. **16** Then the men feared the Lord exceedingly, and they offered a sacrifice to the Lord and made vows. **17** And the Lord appointed a great fish to swallow up Jonah. And Jonah was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights.

# Questions for Reflection (Read all of Jonah)

1. Trace the sovereign actions of God that bring Jonah to a place of repentance (Read chapters 1-2). List all the means God uses to draw Jonah to him. How would you summarize these means?

2. In Jonah 1:12, the prophet requests to be picked up and cast into the sea. Is Jonah's request a desire to save the sailors, a last ditch effort to kill himself in an effort to avoid going to Nineveh (he requested to die twice in Jonah 4), or both?

3. Had Yahweh not provided the fish, would Jonah's desire to die for the sailors accomplish the tasks that Yahweh originally gave him (Jonah 1:1-2)?

4. The water imagery in Jonah 1 and 2 denotes chaos. How was Jonah's life chaotic? What was significant about Jonah being thrown into the sea, and the sea ceased from raging?

5. Jesus, in Matt. 12:38-41, said that Jonah being in the belly of the fish was a sign. We will talk about this more in the coming weeks. But for now, describe how Jonah's actions are not like Jesus (confine your thoughts to Jonah 1-2).

6. Jonah's prayer is laiden with references to the Psalms (Psalm 3:4, 8; 31:6, 22; 42:7; 50:14; 69:1; 88:6-7; 118:8; 120:1). Read through these references. What are the overarching themes?

7. Read Jonah's prayer in chapter 2. Do you discern fruits of sincere repentance (Matt. 3:8; Psalm 51:4; 1 John 1:8-9; Matt. 19:13-15; James 4:7; Gal. 6:1-2;)? How does Jonah 4 shape our view of Jonah 2?

8. What are the fruits of ongoing repentance (living a lifestyle of repentance) in your life? How has the gospel shaped the way you view your ongoing need for it?
