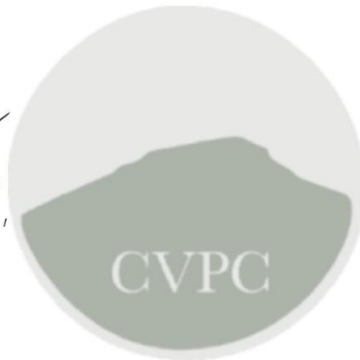

Arise, O Lord, and go to your resting place, you and the ark of your might. Let your priests be clothed with righteousness, and let your saints shout for joy. For the sake of your servant David, do not turn away the face of your anointed one. The Lord swore to David a sure oath from which he will not turn back: "One of the sons of your body I will set on your throne. If your sons keep my covenant and my testimonies that I shall teach them, their sons also forever shall sit on your throne." For the Lord has chosen Zion; he has desired it for his dwelling place: "This is my resting place forever; here I will dwell, for I have desired it. I will abundantly bless her provisions; I will satisfy her poor with bread. Her priests I will clothe with salvation, and her saints will shout for joy. There I will make a horn to sprout for David; I have prepared a lamp for my anointed. His enemies I will clothe with shame, but on him his crown will shine."

Confession of Sin & Assurance of Pardon

L: Dear Father, in this moment we confess our fatigue, our failures and our fears.

ALL: We have lived too long with doubt in our hearts which has resulted in worry and restless sleep.

L: At times we have found ourselves chaffing at your sovereign will and have become discontent with your provision.

ALL: We have become impatient with those you have graciously placed in our lives and often lacked the energy to even repent.

L: We are embarrassed by our secret thoughts and feel the weight of our sins with deep remorse.

ALL: We need mercy. We need grace. We need forgiveness. We are full of need, so propel our faith in this hour by Your Spirit.

L: LORD of Heaven and Earth, God and Father of our Savior, Jesus Christ; pour out your Spirit in abounding measure.

ALL: Overwhelm us with the power of the cross. (time for silent confession)
