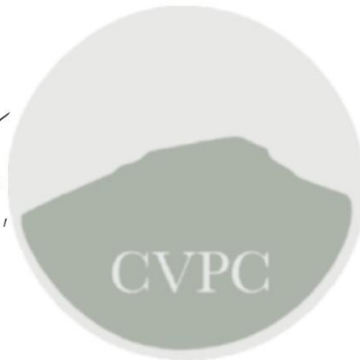

The Marriage Supper of the Lamb Then I heard what seemed to be the voice of a great multitude, like the roar of many waters and like the sound of mighty peals of thunder, crying out, "Hallelujah! Let us rejoice and exult and give him the glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and his Bride has made herself ready; it was granted her to clothe herself with fine linen, bright and pure"—for the fine linen is the righteous deeds of the saints.

Call to Worship: Psalm 42:1-6

Questions for Reflection: Exodus 35 - 36:7 (Give close attention to 35:20 - 36:7)

1. This passage shows one of the rare times Israel as a nation followed Yahweh's commands and served Him wholeheartedly. Can you think of any other times in Israel's history this happened? What do these situations have in common?

2. The word 'congregation' (*Ex. 35:1, 4, 20*) in Hebrew means 'a witness, one who testifies, or testimony.' How is serving God a testimony/ witness of what He has done for you? We are called to serve God (testify to his goodness) with our actions and our attitude. In what ways do we fail at this? In what ways can we succeed at this?

3. Read Exodus 35:20-29 closely and mark every time the words heart and brought are mentioned. What is the connection between the two words? Why would the condition of our heart determine our service to the Lord?

4. What are all the ways the Lord equipped his people (particularly Bezalel, Oholiab, and the women) to serve (*Ex. 35:20 - 36:7*)? Do you see a parallel between how the Lord equipped Old Testament saints and New Testament saints (*Romans 12:3-8 and 1 Cor. 12:4-11*)?

5. What gifts has the Lord given you? (*reread Rom. 12:3-8 and 1 Cor. 12:4-11 as a reference*)? Based on these gifts, how do you see the Lord calling you to serve in this season of life? Have you been presented opportunities to serve within the local church?

6. (*Read Ex. 36:1-7*) Have you ever seen or been a part of a large group where everyone served and went above and beyond the call of duty (*Ex. 36:5-6*)? What was the context of that situation? Have you ever seen this outpouring of service in the life of the church? How can a church foster a culture of service?
