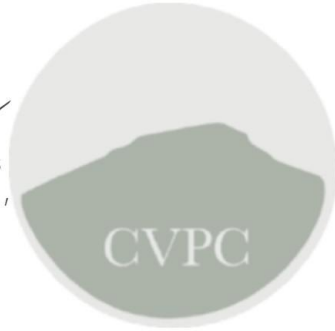

Questions for Reflection: Philippians 4:10-20

1. Why is Paul so concerned about thanking them for their gift, but at the same time, remind them that he would be content without it?

2. Paul says the secret to facing plenty and lack is learning to be content (vs. 11-13). How does plenty and lack lead to discontentment?

3. The Greek word Paul uses for contentment was also used by the Stoics to mean self-sufficiency. Unlike the Stoics who relied on self-sufficiency to overcome difficult circumstances, who does Paul rely on (vs. 13)?

4. According to Paul, not only does Jesus provide inward strength (vs. 13), he also supplies our physical (outward) needs (vs.19). As a Christ-follower, how have you seen God supply your inward and outwards needs during times of plenty and lack?
