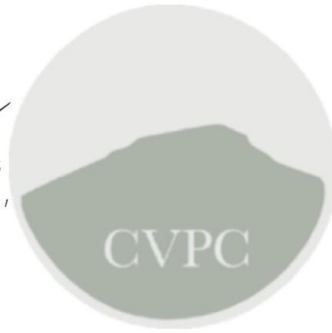

Welcome and Greeting

Meditation: John 19:23-27 | Reader: Mark Duble

When the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took his garments and divided them into four parts, one part for each soldier; also his tunic. But the tunic was seamless, woven in one piece from top to bottom, so they said to one another, "Let us not tear it, but cast lots for it to see whose it shall be." This was to fulfill the Scripture which says, "They divided my garments among them, and for my clothing they cast lots." So

the soldiers did these things, but standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son!" Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home.

Call to Worship: Proverbs 3:1-8

L: My son, do not forget my teaching, but let your heart keep my commandments, for length of days and years of life and peace they will add to you.

ALL: Let not steadfast love and faithfulness forsake you; bind them around your neck; write them on the tablet of your heart. So you will find favor and good success in the sight of God and man.

L: Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.

ALL: Be not wise in your own eyes; fear the Lord, and turn away from evil. It will be healing to your flesh and refreshment to your bones.

L: This is the Word of the Lord!

ALL: Thanks be to God.

At times we find ourselves in despair because of our failings and lack joy because of trying to chase imaginary ways of success. Help us to heed your Word rather than attempting to follow the patterns of this world. We need mercy. We need forgiveness. We need more grace.

(Time of silent confession.)

L: My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.
