Advent III Reading: Zephaniah 3:14-20

Sing aloud, O daughter of Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter of Jerusalem! The Lord has taken away the judgments against you; he has cleared away your enemies. The King of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst; you shall never again fear evil. On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem. "Fear not, O Zion; let not your hands grow weak. The Lord your God is in your midst, a mighty one who will save; he will rejoice over you with gladness; he will quiet you by his love; he will exult over you with loud singing. I will gather those of you who mourn for the festival, so that you will no longer suffer reproach. Behold, at that time I will deal with all your oppressors. And I will save the lame and gather the outcast, and I will change their shame into praise and renown in all the earth. At that time I will bring you in, at the time when I gather you together; for I will make you renowned and praised among all the peoples of the earth, when I restore your fortunes before your eyes," says the Lord.

Luke 3:1-6

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, Pontius Pilate being governor of Judea, and Herod being tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the wilderness. And he went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. Sermon: "The Savior That Brings Justice to the World"

Word: Isaiah 11:1-16

1 There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit.

2 And the Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord. 3 And his delight shall be in the fear of the Lord. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide disputes by what his ears hear, 4 but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; and he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked.

Questions for Reflection

- 1. What does the Bible mean when it talks about justice?
- 2. Is there a difference between biblical justice and our modern day understanding of justice? Are there similarities?
- 3. In Isaiah 11:3-4, it mentions that the Messiah will not judge with eyes or ears, but in righteousness, What does it mean to judge in righteousness (vs. 4)?
- 4. How does the fear of the Lord (vs. 3) help us to both have wisdom and judge rightly?
- 5. Mother Theresa stated that justice without love is not justice. (And) Love without justice is not Love. Christ certainly lived out this principle. Why is both love and justice necessary?
- 6. In the Screwtape Letters, Screwtape encourages Wormwood to not promote justice and charity among men. What is the opposite of justice and charity and what kind of society would that produce?
- 7. How can the church model biblical justice in the world today?
