Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that her warfare is ended, that her iniquity is pardoned, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins. A voice cries: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. And the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken." A voice says, "Cry!" And I said, "What shall I cry?" All flesh is grass, and all its beauty is like the flower of the field. The grass withers, the flower fades when the breath of the Lord blows on it; surely the people are grass. The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever. Go on up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good news; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good news; lift it up, fear not; say to the cities of Judah, "Behold your God!" Behold, the Lord God comes with might, and his arm rules for him; behold, his reward is with him, and his recompense before him. He will tend his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms; he will carry them in his bosom, and gently lead those that are with young.

Questions for Reflection: Read Ruth 3

- 1. Biblical faithfulness can be defined as attentiveness to carry out Yahweh's will purposes in the world. In what ways do you see Yahweh's faithfulness toward the people in chapter 3? In what ways do we see Naomi, Ruth and Boaz's faithfulness towards Yahweh's will and redemptive purposes?
- 2. What makes Naomi and Ruth's conversation about marriage at the beginning of Ruth 3 seem so unconventional (Read Gen. 24 for context)? Did Ruth sin by asking Boaz to marry her?
- 3. What makes Boaz's response to Ruth in vs. 10-13 so surprising (Read Gen. 38:6-11 and Deut. 25:5-10 for context)? By saying that there is a kinsman redeemer who is nearer than him, was Boaz trying to get out of marrying Ruth?
- 4. The chapter ends with a bit of a cliffhanger. Ruth still doesn't know if her efforts will yield the intended results (marriage). How does the cliffhanger at the ending of Ruth 3 inform the uncertainties that often accompany our attempts to be faithful to Yahweh?
- 5. Many scholars and bible commentators point out the sexual induendos and overtunes in Ruth 3 (Uncover his feet and lie down, she layed at his feet, and spread your wings over me). What can we infer about the character of Naomi and Boaz that would indicate that nothing immoral is happening in this text?
- 6. In Ruth 3, Ruth is the picture of covenant faithfulness carried out in an unconventional (not according to the normal way things are done) manner while Boaz is the picture of covenant faithfulness exercised in a conventional (the way things are normally done) manner. In what ways do you see in the Christmas story, Yahweh working through unconventional and conventional means? In what ways did Jesus Christ practice covenant faithfulness in an unconventional and conventional manner?
